Wild Rose- Wetland			Pink/purple blooms. Native bee friendly. Likes wet & moist soils.	Native 10 for \$25
Elderberry- Wildlife Black			Grows to 5-10'. Wildlife. Medicinal plant. Jelly & wine. Likes forest edges and moist areas.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Plum- American			Grows to 10-30'. Animals. Hardy. Erosion control. Likes most soils.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60

Holly- Winterberry			Grows to 3-10'. Pollinators/birds. Bright red berries through winter. Wet acidic soils.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Willow- Black			Grows to 10-60'. Fast growing, loves water, good for stream banks, erosion control.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Birch- Paper			Grows to 30-60'. Moose, birds, boreal forest, pulp wood. Deep, well drained soils.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Birch- Yellow			Grows to 60-80'. Deer, grouse, songbirds. Good with hemlock, not with sugar maple.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Birch- River			Grows to 40-90'. Birds, deer, hummingbirds. Wetlands, riverbanks, moist soil.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Maple- Red			Grows to 60-90'. Most animals. Likes well drained soil.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Maple- Sugar			Grows to 90-120'. Most animals. Maple syrup. Likes sandy-loam soil types.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Maple- Silver			Grows to 35-55'. Wildlife. Grows quickly, weak wood. Erosion control, likes water.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Oak- White			Grows to 80-100'. Acorns, wildlife. Slow growing, very long-lived. Many soils.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Oak- Bur			Grows to 70-80'. Large acorns. Wildlife/deer. Lives 200-400 years. Drought & soil tolerant.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Oak- Red			Grows to 70-90'. Straight/ tall. Timber. Slow growing, very long-lived. Many soil types.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
Oak- Swamp White			Grows to 50-60'. Acorns, wildlife. Likes sun. Acidic moist, well-drained soils.	Native 25 Bareroot for \$60
